## To The Honorable the Common Council of the City of Yonkers:

The President & Vice Presidents of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union of this City – do petition your honorable body as follows –

That, in confirming the nomination of the third member of the Excise Board, you will act with the utmost care, as in the presence of God, awake to the fact, that results of the greatest magnitude grow out of this action.

They thus petition because this Board, when appointed, will carry in its hand the welfare of all our citizens, and in a peculiar and cruel degree the welfare of women.

And because they are fearful unless they so petition, both the christian and temperance portion of the community will not be therein represented; an omission that will seem to them both unjust and unwise. They therefore ask that this part of the community be represented by a

man of high conscientiousness, untrammeled by the need of business favors, to the end that the Excise law be enforced according to its spirit, and that traffic in liquors be not legalized as a common business. And they furthermore presume to add, as another motive for carefulness, that while they think [inserted: it may] be their sons who, in the next decade, will be breaking mother's hearts, it may be your daughters who will be within their graves, dead of broken hearts; broken by the liquor traffic, made stronger by this decision.

Suffer them to assure you, most honorable gentlemen, that hundreds of prayers, touching this question, bring you under the immediate consideration of our God, who is faithful to the cry of the weak. Therefore, in behalf of the households of this City whose slain are already so many, and most emphatically in behalf of women, do they submit to you this petition, asking you to choose for them life and not death.
